















Artist Kara Walker Silhouettes Paper Cut Outs

Draw and cut out an animal shape. Maybe one from the Chinese Lunar Calendar?






Home Gallery

Make frames and labels for your art gallery at home.


Step by Step Directions to Make a Frame




Square or Rectangle piece of paper




Important! Place fold down.



Cut on line.
Do not cut on fold!







Cut on lines and remove center.

Unfold to see the frame

Glue or tape picture inside the frame.

Make a label for your art:
Artist's name
Medium (What did you use to Make it?)
Title
