




#### Diagram of Classroom Flow

#### The 5-Minute Demo


Here is an example from my Youtube channel. Over the years, my student teachers and I have built up a repertoire of videos.

- Keep the video focused on your hands and materials.



## Studio Time

Get out of the way! Teacher role shifts to facilitator and provocateur.



#### What does it look like in my classroom?

- Students are focused & engaged
- Students dialogue with peers about art
- Hands are busy
- Students remain in their studio choice

Students were set up for success through meticulous planning.

- Expectations about care and use of materials
- 5-minute demos
- Physical layout of classroom and traffic flow
- Design and create studios;
   select materials to include
- Behavior management plan

- Artwork storage
- Adjust curriculum pacing
- ☐ Revise assessment strategies
- Personal philosophy and rationale for TAB
- Advocacy and education about
   TAB for students, parents, and
   admin

#### Look Again.

#### To make flow happen, students were taught:

- How to gather materials and set up their work space
- How to use materials
- How to plan and create their own ideas or explore
- ☐ How to share
- How to focus and engage
- ☐ How to fix mistakes
- How to decide when an artwork is finished

## Clean Up


COVID-19 Closures disrupted my plans to finish filming what clean up looks like. I will add on to this section when we return to face-to-face.





#### A Partial Look at Clean Up





Students clean up their own work space and help clean the studio they worked in. I teach and re-teach the routine throughout the year. By mid-year, students can successfully clean up within 5 minutes.

#### A Partial Look at Clean Up



Students return to their Home Base table (assigned seat) to put art in a table folder and fill out a Studio Tracker. \*

Students raise their hand to get their Studio Tracker checked and permission to line-up. Clean up and filling out trackers takes 10 minutes.

## Presenting Art

Artwork produced in a TAB studio is student-led and features child aesthetics rather than teacher-imposed adult aesthetics. The child is the artist.
